The numbers are staggering. On any given night, there are over 500,000 homeless individuals in America (men, women, and children) without a place to call home. Locally, in our own bi-state community, we have counted 386 individuals who have no real home. These are men, women and children who are couch-surfing, living in their car, a tent, in a shelter or out on the street.

The definition of homeless reads, "any person who lacks housing". A question that often comes to mind is, why are so many people experiencing homelessness in today's society? There are many factors that contribute to a person experiencing homelessness; loss of a job, mounting debt, drug/alcohol abuse and those transitioning out of jail or prison are just a few. Chronic homelessness is defined as either long-term and/or repeated bouts of homelessness coupled with a disability that can be physical or mental.

Homelessness is not something that just happens to someone else. Seven out of ten American families are just one paycheck away from being homeless. The National Coalition for the Homeless reported that a minimum wage worker earning \$7.25 per hour needs to work 3.5 fulltime jobs just to afford rent in a safe, affordable neighborhood.

If we, as a nation, intend to help those who are less fortunate, we cannot wait for a better time than today. Let's start here and now. By donating to Christian Care (in-kind, financial, volunteer time), you can impact the lives of those we serve.

#GivingTuesday is the Tuesday after Thanksgiving (November 28, 2017) and is a national day of giving. It is a day dedicated to encourage more, better and smarter giving during the holiday season and we are proud to be a part of this national campaign.
