Residents at Christian Care are encouraged and empowered to take control of their destiny. They are given the resources and support necessary to make positive changes in every aspect of their lives.

This past fall, several of the veterans that reside at Christian Care have had the opportunity to participate in Sundance for Our Soldiers, or SOS. "It was not at all what I expected," said Calvin, a Navy veteran who's participated in

two SOS sessions, "but I would do it again."

SOS is a non-profit that provides Equine-Assisted Psychotherapy to active military, veterans, and their families with the goal of helping them live a healthier, happier life. The sessions involve a series of problem solving and team building activities, a debriefing about the activities, and some short periods of down time to interact individually with the horses. Despite a popular assumption, there is no horse-back riding involved. The sessions concentrate on self-reflection, discovery, and personal growth.

"I grew up on horses, so this was a different experience for me, not to be able to climb up on one," shared Lee, a Vietnam veteran who also served in the Navy when asked for his thoughts on the activities. Lee is referring to an activity in which veterans are asked to corral a horse into a square on the ground created from wooden posts, the challenge being that you are not permitted to touch the horse.

"Activities like these are important because they give veterans the opportunity to get out of the shelter environment, and to spend time with other veterans alone—for them to engage with one another, and become comfortable expressing what they've each been through," said Cindi Gramenz. Cindi is Christian Care's Grant Writer and Development Coordinator and participated in one session as a veteran herself.

As new veterans are welcomed into Christian Care, they will be offered the chance to participate in SOS. Terry, who has signed up for the next session is looking forward to it, going in with the goal of improving communication skills with peers, gaining tranquility, and a learning experience. If his experience is anything like the other participants had, he'll be willing to try it again.
