Helping Veterans Find Hope and Homes

Gerald came into Christian Care in February after losing his apartment. Gerald is a veteran and was enrolled into our Grants and Per Diem Program (GPD), the goal of which is to provide supportive housing and services to veterans to help them achieve residential stability, increase their skill levels and/or income, and obtain greater self-determination. Veterans can reside in a GPD program for up to two years while working on recovery, employment and independent living skills.

Gerald was experiencing both mental health and physical health issues and found himself no longer able to hold a job. Gerald owed a considerable amount of back rent and his landlord was no longer able to continue working with him. He was forced to leave the apartment he called "home" for 3 years. Gerald contacted Christian Care and came into the program shortly thereafter.

Gerald met with the Resident Services Coordinator at

Christian Care on a weekly basis and sometimes more often depending on needs. Gerald and the RSC discussed Gerald's strengths and the specific barriers he experiences currently, as well as in recent years. With the help of Christian Care staff, Gerald developed a service plan outlining the goals he would like to meet while at Christian Care, as well as the specific action steps necessary to meet his goals.

In the 6 ½ months Gerald was at Christian Care he worked daily on his goals. All of Gerald's hard work and persistence paid off and in September he moved into his own apartment. Gerald says, "I am very grateful for Christian Care. Without their direction and assistance, I would not be where I am today."
