Overcoming Barriers at Christian Care

Pedro came to Christian Care on 11/15/19. Pedro is a Lawful Permanent Resident, also referred to as a Green Card holder. On average it takes 7 to 33 months to process a Green Card application, but it can take up to 10 years depending on the type of Green Card, the wait time, and yearly caps. Green Card holders are entitled to apply for U.S. citizenship after "showing by a preponderance of evidence that they have continuously resided in the U.S. for at least five years and are persons of good, moral character," according to the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA). Permanent residents are considered "aliens" or citizens of another country and therefore face numerous limitations of rights afforded to U.S. -born citizens.

Although statistics show the foreign-born population is 42.1 million and growing, this sizeable community is often invisible due to discrimination and marginalization. Immigrants face discrimination in accessing education, good jobs, and stable housing, making immigrants particularly vulnerable to becoming homeless.



Individuals like Pedro face unique barriers that lead to and perpetuate homelessness: employment, economic, educational, and language barriers, as well as difficulty in accessing federal and state services/benefits (food stamps, housing, Medicaid). If an individual also has any mental or physical disabilities, these barriers can become insurmountable.

Fortunately for Pedro, he has a supportive brother and sister-in-law to help him navigate the system and assist with translation and other services. Pedro speaks primarily Spanish and due to this language barrier is extremely isolated. Christian Care has become a sense of community for him, he enjoys being here, and he feels safe. He describes his overall experience at Christian Care as, "Excelente!" Through our case management services, Pedro received assistance with obtaining housing and will be getting his own apartment soon. We look forward to continuing a relationship with Pedro as he explores becoming a regular volunteer.
