# Christian Care Offers Hope and a New Outlook on Life

William experienced homelessness for the first time in his life earlier this year after leaving an abusive relationship. He grew up witnessing his mother being abused and, after finding himself in an unhealthy relationship as an adult, knew he needed to stop the generational repetition that often occurs with children who experience domestic violence.

When William left the apartment he shared with his abuser, he found himself living in a car until he heard about Christian Care from a relative. He was able to move in just one day after making his initial crisis call. William had a lot of anxiety, feeling very down and depressed about his circumstances: just the thought of going into a shelter can be overwhelming, intimidating, and scary. But he had the additional challenges of limited income and significant health issues.

William had never been to a homeless shelter before but expressed feeling at ease almost immediately upon entering Christian Care. He said, "The staff at Christian Care gave me hope and a new outlook on life." Through case advocacy, William found the determination and tools he needed to become self-sufficient again. Despite being in and out of the hospital several times during his stay, he found a job and is in the process of securing permanent housing.



William said, "Overall, Christian Care has made me stronger, more confident, and a happier person." He said the advice he would give to other people in his situation is: "Don't dwell on the past. Don't let things that have happened in your life discourage you. Everything happens for a reason and it is possible to overcome even the toughest obstacles in front of you."

We are very proud of William. His tenacity and perseverance have put him back on the road to self-sufficiency.
