I also began developing Waters, a conceptual project that blends design with social impact. My growth wasn't just professional - it was spiritual too. I started reading a Bible study called Footsteps in Faith, which became a source of strength and **reflection.** The group helped me stay grounded, and I've decided to continue participating as a volunteer, supporting others on their own journey's of faith and renewal. Living in a communal environment came with its challenges, but it taught me resilience, empathy, and the power of perseverance. Now, as I prepare to move into my own place, I carry with me not just gratitude for Christian Care's support, but a renewed sense of purpose and hope.

was staying at a motel due to me being laid-off from my job as a maintenance worker at an apartment complex because of budget cuts. This resulted in me losing my apartment that went with the job. I had a place to stay with my aunt for several months, but her health declined resulting in her moving into a nursing home. My stay at the motel did not last long. I also had health issues, and heart failure. I brought myself to Christian Care and registered for the waiting list to receive a bed. It took several weeks, then I was given a bed, clothes, a shower, three meals a day, and a case worker, Angela. Happy and relieved that I received aid, 3-4 months later in August, there was an opening at Two Rivers - a place to call home. I am very happy and give great thanks to the Christian Care staff. They were kind, understanding, and very helpful, especially Angela. The residents were also pleasant and understanding. Many thanks and love to Christian Care. A bed, laundry, clothes, medical attention, and three meals a day - you CAN do it if your homeless and out of work. God bless Christian Care and thank you all.
